

Why



The platform was created to establish an intensive exchange within early music institutes in order to share challenges and best practices.

How and Who

- A working group of representatives of prominent Early Music institutes was formed in 2008
- Two days conference on a chosen theme relevant to teachers of Early

 Music
- Key-note speaker and various presentations exploring these themes giving the participants opportunities to be active in dialogues and discussions
- Number of participants from. 60 to 120, mainly renowned artists and teachers from the Early Music scene affiliated with a music institute of higher education

Where

 The hosting institution is given the opportunity to present their institute with sessions, concerts and musical interludes
