### Pre-Conference Seminar 1

#### Horizon 2020 - Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions: Individual Fellowships Opportunity for Music Research (MSCA – IF)

*Individual Fellowships (IF) enhances the creative and innovative potential of experienced researchers, wishing to diversify their individual competence in terms of skill acquisition through advanced training, international and intersectoral mobility. IF provides opportunities to researchers of any nationality to acquire and transfer new knowledge and to work on research and innovation in Europe (EU Member States and Horizon 2020 Associated Countries) and beyond.*

The seminar aims to explore and analyse in-depth the opportunities offered by the MSCA – IF programme to music actors: notably teachers, researchers, post-doc and PhD students.

MSCA – IF is the main research programme – in terms of funds and potential future career development - for individuals within the framework of Horizon 2020.

The last call is expected to be opened the 8<sup>th</sup> April 2020, while the Deadline is the 9<sup>th</sup> September. Then, the seminar will carefully scan the application procedures and contents of the programme, tailoring the training sessions to the participants from the music & musicology sector.

As the opportunities for the music field have been barely exploited up to now, the pragmatic approach of the seminar will enable participants to conceive, prepare and apply for a potential successful proposal, even by giving specific tips and hints.

The seminar will focus in particular on the following actions:

- MSCA-IF-EF-ST Standard European Fellowships
- MSCA-IF-GF Global Fellowships
- MSCA-IF-EF-CAR Career Restart panel

The following topics that will be examined during the seminar:

- Presentation of the Call for proposal MSCA-IF 2020
- Online application procedures
- Forms review
- Award criteria.

After the introduction to the philosophy and concept of the programme, participants will test their newly acquired projects skills and abilities through targeted session based on practise exercises on how to write a successful proposal. Eventually, the projects sample elaborated and produced during the seminar will be reviewed and precisely commented, even by comparing the produced papers with some thematic successful stories.
